*Proceedings of the Indian National Congress Vol:1 1885 -1889* is a unique documentation. This volume is the first in a series of the 13 volume-set to be published by Niyogi Books at intervals of around six months.

The first Indian National Congress was held in 1885, one year after the Marquess of Ripon left India. 'For India's Congress party to have survived for a century is in itself no small achievement'. It successfully transformed itself from movement to party in order to change from protest to governance ...'

This volume, like others to be published, is not just a record of Congress speeches and resolutions, but it also captures the mental, emotional, and political life of late-nineteenth century India.

Scores of books exist on the Indian National Congress. A different route has been taken to illuminate the birth of an idea that has captured the imagination of millions. This is probably the first authentic version of the Congress proceedings; earlier printed texts were either abridged or tampered with.

Professor Mushirul Hasan is an internationally renowned historian, prolific author and former Vice-Chancellor of Jamia Milia Islamia University, Delhi. Professor Hasan has also authored *Partners in Freedom: Jamia Milia Islamia* (Niyogi Books, 2006); *Mutiny Memoirs* (Niyogi Books, 2009); and *The Avadh Punch: Wit and Humour in Colonial North India* (2007) and *Wit and Wisdom: Pickings from the Parsee Punch* (2012) as part of the Punch series brought out by Niyogi Books.

He has written extensively on the Partition of India, on communalism and on the histories of Islam in South Asia. Professor Hasan was the elected President of the Indian History Congress in 2002. In 2007, he was awarded the Padma Shri by the Government of India and in 2010 the Ordre des Palmes Académiques was conferred upon him by the French Government. He is presently the Director General of the National Archives of India.
